To the Member of Parliament for _____,

As our elected federal representative, we bring to your attention the World Health Organization's (WHO) proposed changes to the 2005 International Health Regulations (IHR 2005) and proposed new Pandemic Agreement (Pandemic reforms).

These Pandemic reforms have still not been finalised. Yet both Pandemic reforms are expected to be voted upon by Australia and 193 member states of the WHO at the 77th World Health Assembly being held from 27 May 2024.

A positive vote to both Pandemic reforms infers Australia will be intending on implementing the Pandemic reforms.

These Pandemic reforms are currently being negotiated without appropriate transparency, knowledge, and input by Australia, in contravention of the WHO's constitution.

As our elected representative we ask you insist that the Department of Health (amendments to the 2005 IHRs) and the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade (Pandemic Agreement) reject both Pandemic reforms.

Alternatively, voting should be postponed on both Pandemic reforms so Australia has adequate time to consider the implications of the Treaty reforms. **No individual or nation should sign contracts they have never seen.**

By reply, please advise:

1. Your specific position on the Pandemic reforms (both the amendments to the 2005 IHRs and the Pandemic Agreement).
2. The specific actions you are taking to ensure that these Pandemic reforms are rejected by the respective departments in time for the May 2024 vote at the 77th World Health Assembly. Alternatively, that voting in May is postponed.
